Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

The past 15 months have been quite a journey. I think of all who have been impacted by the pandemic - those who contracted the coronavirus including those without symptoms, those with symptoms recuperating at home, those requiring hospitalization, the so-called "long haulers", and, sadly, those who died of COVID-19. I think of those personal and family finances were affected by lost or reduced employment and those who occupation required them to keep working despite the risks - health care professionals, first responders, and grocery store workers, to name a few. I think of those who experienced a non-COVID-related death of a loved one during the pandemic - eliminated or reduced access to the loved one as he or she was dying and delayed Funeral Rites often leading to prolonged and complicated grief. I think of delayed and modified Sacramental Celebrations - Baptisms, Confirmations, First Communions, Weddings. I think of the children and young people whose education has been impacted, and their parents making sacrifices to be involved with their virtual schooling. I think of those whose final year(s) of high school, college, or graduate school, and the graduation celebrations that go with that, were impacted.

Our parishes, too, have been impacted. From March 13 through May 29, 2020, we were not open for public Masses, forcing us to get creative and embrace technology to make Mass available to you online and provide resources for staying close to your faith, precisely at a time when we all needed our faith most. Thanks be to God, we have been open for public celebration of Masses and Sacraments since Pentecost 2020 (May 30/31), even if it was with necessary safety protocols in place. Pentecost 2021 is next weekend - May 22 and 23. At Pentecost, we celebrate our belief that the sending of the Holy Spirit brought the Church to birth, opening to all peoples the knowledge of God and bringing together the many languages of the earth in one profession in faith. Though we can praise and pray to God in any place, at any time, there is nothing like the Church assembling together in the local parish church to "praise the Lord's name in the midst of the assembly" (Psalm 22:23b) in the ultimate prayer, the greatest event on earth - the Mass, the Eucharist. Mass on television, radio, or the internet provide a stopgap option for those who, because of age or illness or are in danger of illness, but cannot replace praising the Lord's name in the midst of the assembly and receiving Holy Communion, the Body of Christ.

While we continue to request that you wear a mask, observe social distancing, and participate from home if you are not feeling well, I am happy to share with you these adjustments to parish life, especially the celebration of Masses and other Sacraments. All of these go into effect May 22, 2021, unless otherwise indicated.

Pre-registration and check-in eliminated. The need to pre-register and check-in for Mass will end after May 23. As a result, you will be able to enter any of the doors to the church.

Full singing returns. While we have been singing the Gloria, Gospel Acclamation, and Eucharistic Acclamations for the past seven weeks, we will resume singing the Responsorial Psalm and hymns at Mass. Each week, you will receive a single-use worship/participation aid as you enter church. Please take it home with you or place it in the recycling bins that will be available at the doors of the church as you leave.

Communion Procession adjusted. The Communion Procession will once again start with the first rows in the church and move to the back. In the center aisle, each side can come forward together, two by two. Once Holy Communion is distributed in the main body of the church, the Ministers of Holy Communion, whether they be Ordinary or Extraordinary, will move to the sides of the church. Distribution of Holy Communion in the hand will continue to be the preferred method for receiving Holy Communion.

Parking lot participation continues. While participation in the parking lots through FM 91.3 is available at all Masses, Holy Communion will be distributed Saturday at 4:00 PM and Sunday at 10:00 AM in Hull and Sunday at 8:30 and 11:30 AM in Cohasset.

Livestreaming continues but limited. Livestreaming has been invaluable during the pandemic and will continue to be important of our ministry moving forward. Our current practice is to livestream all Masses in either church - daily Mass Monday through Friday and seven Masses on Saturday and Sunday. Moving forward, we will continue to livestream all daily Masses and reduce the livestreaming of weekend Masses from seven to four - Saturday 4:00 PM (Hull) and 5:30 PM (Cohasset) and Sunday 8:30 AM (Cohasset) and 10:00 a.m. (Hull). Remember that once the livestream has ended, the video remains available on the parish's Facebook page or YouTube channel anytime. Of course, livestreaming will continue to be available for Funerals, Weddings, Baptisms, and other Sacramental Celebrations (Confirmation, First Communion, etc.)

Safety announcements during Mass reduced. We will reduce in length and number the safety announcements we have been making during Mass.

Offertory Collection Resumes on May 22 and May 23

ffertory collection resumes. We will "pass the basket" to collect the offertory at the usual time. When special collections are scheduled (like Pentecost - May 22 and 23 for the seminaries and seminarians) we will place baskets at the doors or near the baptismal font (Hull) to receive these offerings. At the same time, we highly recommend switching to electronic giving. Please contact the parish offices for additional information.

Sunday Evening Mass Moves to Hull on June 6 New Time 5:00 PM

unday 6:00 PM Mass moves to 5:00 PM for the foreseeable future and from Cohasset to Hull for the summer months. As the collaborative had planned prior to my arrival but did not do in 2020 due to the pandemic, the Sunday afternoon Mass will move from Cohasset to Hull for the summer months (June, July, August). In addition, after discussion with the staffs, the time of the Sunday evening Mass will change from 6:00 PM to 5:00 PM effective June 6th





orn to a Spanish shepherd family, Paschal was said to have taught himself to read while tending sheep. At age 21, he joined an austere group of Franciscans, devoting himself to prayer and charity. He was sent on a dangerous mission to French Franciscans, and a shoulder wound he received caused him pain for the rest of his life. Long hours of prayer on his knees before the Eucharist earned this lay brother the honor of being patron of Catholic Eucharistic congresses. His emblem in art is a monstrance.






