From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

“In truth I see that God shows no partiality.”

Acts 10:34

With a little reflection, these powerful words from our second reading this weekend on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord should shake us to the bone. There are at least three possible reasons for that.

First, do we really believe these words? Do we believe that we are just as special in the eyes of our loving God as everyone else, or do we measure ourselves in the ways of the world and then conclude that we just don't measure up? God must love those “successful” ones more. God surely is partial to them. Intellectually of course, we know God sees beyond the superficiality of worldly success. God sees each and every one of us as beloved in and through Jesus. Nevertheless, whenever we do not fully embrace that truth in our heart, our ungodly partiality is revealed.

Second, do we sometimes secretly hold that we are better than others? After all we are successful, faithful Catholics. We do not lie or provide fake news like that other political party. We are the ones with truth and right on our side. Nevertheless, whenever pride replaces humility, our ungodly partiality is again revealed.

Third, do we live our lives in such a way that no matter how hard we try we simply show partiality towards some and not others? Face it, some people are simply easier to spend time with than others. We favor their company, their conversation. Be very careful here, however. Having such favorites is not exactly what it means to show no partiality in a spiritual/religious context. Showing no partiality is not a matter of feelings, of ordinary likes and dislikes, but is a matter of justice. It calls us to treat others and act in ways that correspond to our first reading from Isaiah: not to break a bruised reed or quench a smoldering wick. Nevertheless, whenever the temptation we sometimes experience to think or say, *we know how all those X's are* (substitute for X any sexual orientation, racial, gender, religious or ethnic group) we not only unjustly bruise and smolder others, but once again reveal our ungodly partiality.

Are you shaken yet? Perhaps not, since we can easily hide behind the idea that none of us is God.

Consider, however, the call of our baptism – to die to our old self: to die to that self that refuses to embrace both oneself and the other, that self that is not compassionately just, that self that reveals ungodly partiality.

Beloved of God – we are all sinners in need of a savior whether we realize it or not.

In Jesus's baptism there is hope for us sinners. By his plunging into the Jordan, Jesus fulfilled all righteousness and reveals

Estimados Feligreses:

"En verdad, veo que Dios no hace distinción."

Hechos 10:34

Como una pequeña reflexión, las poderosas palabras de nuestra segunda lectura de este fin de semana, en la fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, debieran sacudirnos hasta los huesos. Al menos, hay tres posibles razones para ello.

Primero, ¿realmente creemos en estas palabras? ¿Creemos que somos tan especiales a los ojos de nuestro Dios amoroso como todos los demás, o nos medimos en los caminos del mundo y luego llegamos a la conclusión de que simplemente no llegamos a la medida? Dios debe amar más a esos "exitosos". Dios seguramente es parcial hacia ellos. Intellectualmente, sabemos que Dios ve más allá de la superficialidad del éxito mundano. Dios ve a todos y cada uno de nosotros como amados en y a través de Jesús. Sin embargo, no aceptamos plenamente esa verdad en nuestro corazón, se revela así nuestra parcialidad impía.

Segundo, ¿no sostenemos a veces, en secreto, de que somos mejores que otros? Después de todo, somos católicos fieles y exitosos. No mentimos ni proporcionamos noticias falsas como ese otro partido político. Somos los que tenemos la verdad y la justicia de nuestro lado. Sin embargo, cada vez que el orgullo reemplaza a la humildad, nuestra parcialidad impía se revela de nuevo.

Tercero, ¿vivimos nuestras vidas de tal manera que no importa cuánto lo intentemos simplemente mostramos parcialidad hacia algunos y no hacia otros? Enfréntenlo, hay personas con las que simplemente es más fácil llevarse bien. Favorecemos su compañía, su conversación. Sin embargo, tengan mucho cuidado aquí. Tener tales favoritismos no es precisamente lo que significa mostrar imparcialidad en un contexto espiritual/religioso. Mostrar imparcialidad no es cuestión de sentimientos, de gustos y aversiones comunes, sino que es cuestión de justicia. Se nos llama a tratar a los demás y a actuar de manera que se corresponda con nuestra primera lectura de Isaías: a no romper una caña resquebrajada o apagar la mecha que aún humea. Sin embargo, cada vez que caemos en la tentación que a veces experimentamos de pensar o decir: *sabemos cómo son todas esas/as X* (sustituyan la X por cualquier orientación sexual, racial, género, grupo religioso o étnico) no sólo injustamente rompemos y apagamos a los demás, sino que, de nuevo, revelamos nuestra parcialidad impía.

¿Están ya conmocionados? Tal vez no, ya que podemos escondernos fácilmente detrás de la idea de que ninguno de nosotros es Dios.

Sin embargo, consideremos el llamado de nuestro bautismo – a morir a nuestro antiguo ser: morir a ese ser que se niega a

Dear Joe, Christ's Peace!

I am taking a chance that this letter might arrive before Christmas. More likely, it will arrive in the octave of Christmas.

I wanted to extend my thanks to you and your parishioners for their on-going support of St. Anne's here in Kingston. They should know that we are now serving almost 150 persons per week in our food distribution program. We have been able to send adults to a skills training program offered by the Marist Missionary Sisters. They are trained in housekeeping, home nursing, and food and beverage. Completion of their training is an important milestone for these adults and it offers them the hope of a new beginning in life. Our parish dancers performed magnificently at a Jamaica Day competition organized by the Archdiocese. Persons were genuinely amazed by their skill and creativity. It was quite a sight to see! We are helping numerous young people with lunch money each week so that they have at least one meal for the day. We've also been able to help persons obtain the drugs, or medical supplies, that otherwise would not be available to them. The health care system here is not the most well organized or efficient, but they try their best to offer what care they can to all who present themselves. Life continues here even as it is a struggle for most of our people.

The security situation is much better. The zone of special operations remains in place. We still have periodic shootings but not with the frequency of the past. They are also keeping their heavy weapons in hiding! It has been a blessing for our people to experience a certain lessening of the gun violence that was once a daily occurrence.

I want to wish you and all your parishioners a truly joyous Christmas! May your celebration of the birth of Jesus Christ renew you in his love and fill you with many graces.



### **Migration Facts:**

1. In 2017 immigrants accounted for 13.6% of the 324 million people in U.S. population. More than 1/6 of Massachusetts residents are foreign-born: almost 1.2 million people, or 16.9% of the population; another one-seventh are U.S.-born but have at least one foreign-born parent.
2. Massachusetts' foreign-born population is particularly diverse, with no nationality making up even 10% of the total. The top countries of origin for immigrants here include China, India, Brazil, Portugal, Haiti, Cape Verde, the Dominican Republic, Vietnam, El Salvador and Canada.
3. Immigrants are a significant part of our workforce: 1 in 5 workers in the Commonwealth was born in another country.

### **Reflection:**

Pope Francis has used four verbs to frame our obligations toward migrant populations:

**Welcoming.** Offering broader options for migrants and refugees to enter destination countries safely and legally.

**Protecting.** Defending the rights and dignity of migrants, independent of their legal status.

**Promoting.** Ensuring that all migrants and refugees are empowered to achieve their potential as human beings.

**Integrating.** Helping immigrants to become active, participating members of our communities.

How could you better welcome, protect, promote and integrate these specific individuals or families? 


