## From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

*"We are so used to breathing the smog of racism that we don't even see it when it is right in front of us."*

This quote was recently shared with me as I was reflecting upon what I might write for this weekend's bulletin when our nation honors the memory of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. I knew I wanted to say something about a book I recently finished: *How to Be an Antiracist* by Ibram X. Kendi. When I read this quote, it immediately captured and summarized for me so much of what that book was about. Even the author, an African-American, admits how often in his own life's history he too not only breathed in that smog of racism but helped to fan it along.

He recalls, for instance, that as a HS senior he "served up racist ideas" during an MLK speech competition by not realizing that when you say something is wrong with or indicate or imply inferiority about a racial group as a whole, you say something racist.

Certainly, many, if not all of us, try not to be racist. In fact, we sometimes vehemently deny we are racists, even going so far as proclaiming we are "color blind." Contrarily, Kendi points out that "the claim of being 'not racist' or color blind is actually a mask for racism."

Do you find that surprising or harsh? [I sheepishly admit, I did.]

Kendi suggests that we may find this so because we have wrongly used the word, 'racist,' pejoratively, as a slur, instead of descriptively. "Failing to see race," he writes, "fails to see racism and falls into racist passivity." Instead, we are to see race, consistently identify and describe racism, and then dismantle it.

To do that, one must become an antiracist. That is, "one either believes problems are rooted in groups of people, as a racist, or locates the roots of problems in power and policies, as an antiracist."

To put this another way, whenever we generalize the behavior of one person saying, well that is because that person is Hispanic, Asian, Black, White or belongs to some particular group, we in effect smear the whole group. Antiracists, on the other hand, simply see individuals behaving positively or negatively; they do not see individuals as representatives of whole races or groups. Kendi encourages us, therefore, to "deracialize behavior ... behavior is something humans do, not races do."

There is so much more I would like to share with you about Kendi's insightful, challenging, eye-opening book. I hope this

Estimados Feligreses:

*"Estamos tan acostumbrados a respirar el smog del racismo que ni siquiera lo vemos cuando está justo frente a nosotros."*

Esta cita me la compartieron mientras reflexionaba sobre lo que podría escribir para el boletín de este fin de semana cuando nuestra nación honra la memoria del Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Sabía que quería decir algo sobre un libro que terminé recientemente: *Cómo ser un antirracista* por Ibram X. Kendi. Cuando leí esta cita, esta inmediatamente capturó y resumió para mí mucho de lo que se trataba ese libro. Incluso el

autor, un afroamericano, admite la frecuencia con la que en su propia historia él también no sólo respiraba en ese smog de racismo, sino que ayudó a avivarlo.

Recuerda, por ejemplo, que como Senior de su Escuela Secundaria "se sirvió de ideas racistas" durante una competencia de discursos de MLK al no caer en cuenta que cuando dices que algo está mal, indicas o implicas inferioridad sobre un grupo racial en su conjunto, dices algo racista.

Ciertamente, muchos, si no todos, intentamos no ser racistas. De hecho, a veces negamos con vehemencia ser racistas, incluso llegamos a proclamar que somos "daltónicos". Por el contrario, Kendi señala que "la afirmación de ser "no racista" o daltónico es en realidad una máscara del racismo."


¿Te parece sorprendente o duro? [Lo admito tímidamente, lo admito.]

Kendi sugiere que podemos encontrar esto así porque hemos utilizado erróneamente la palabra, 'racista', peyorativamente, como una calumnia, en lugar de descriptivamente. "tratando de ver raza", escribe, "no ve el racismo y cae en la pasividad racista". En su lugar, debemos ver la raza, identificar y describir constantemente al racismo, y luego desmantelarlo.

Para hacer eso, uno debe convertirse en un antirracista. Es decir, "uno cree que los problemas tienen sus raíces en grupos de personas, como racistas, o ubica las raíces de los problemas en el poder y las políticas, como antirracistas."

Para decirlo de otra manera, cada vez que generalizamos el comportamiento de una persona diciendo, bueno eso es porque esa persona es hispana, asiática, negra, blanca o pertenece a algún grupo en particular, en efecto desprestigiamos a todo el grupo. Los antirracistas, por otro lado, simplemente ven a los individuos comportarse positiva o negativamente; no ven a los individuos como representantes de razas o grupos. Kendi nos anima, por lo tanto, a "desracializar el comporta




