

Interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and possibly exploring a path toward full communion with the Church in the Catholic tradition?

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) team is available to talk about the Catholic faith for anyone interested in learning more about what it means to be a Christian in the Catholic faith tradition. We are ready and willing to support those inquiring about becoming Christian or those from other Christian faith backgrounds

interested in possibly coming into full communion with the Catholic Church.

We gather each year on a weekly basis with people interested in learning more about the Catholic faith and possibly seeking one or more of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist). We typically have a period of inquiry, a catechumenate period of learning more about our faith, and a reflective period of purification and enlightenment leading to the Sacraments of Initiation at Easter. During this time of covid-19, we are taking a flexible approach that could be at least partially virtual and on a timeline that both fits the inquirers and the constraints due to the coronavirus.

One's faith is central to one's life, however, and we encourage inquirers at any time, covid-19 or not! Is it not our faith that really is our guiding compass in life and really all that stays with us at the end of our life's journey on earth?

When the long time pastor of our parish died, many people remembered him as a generous man. Story after story

was told of how much he helped families, supplying food, cars, clothes, jobs and tuition in their time of need. He came from a wealthy family and he used his own money to make a difference in the lives of parishioners, neighbors and those who came knocking at the door. More importantly, he gave his time and a listening ear. People felt understood and renewed and it was this gift that made a difference.

The Gospel parable of the owner hiring workmen is a model of generosity. The owner hires workers at different times of the day, yet pays each one equally, because wages are not just a luxury. For his workers, it means food on the table and a roof over a family's head. His generosity is not about money, but about respecting the dignity of the workers.

Generosity can be measured in many ways, and offered in many forms. Simply handing someone money might be generous; but giving time and attention is even more so. Such generosity can renew the spirit, create a bond, restore dignity and inspire hope. Give what counts and you too can make a difference.

Very little is known about the preaching of Bartholomew. It seems that he worked in the area around the south end of the Caspian Sea, and was martyred in the year 68 A.D. at a place called Albanopolis (which is now called Derbend).

Even the manner of his death is uncertain. According to some traditions, he was beheaded; but others say that he was crucified (upside down, like Saint Peter).




