### From the Desk of the Pastor

#### Dear Parishioners,

Last week in anticipation of Thanksgiving, Karen O'Reilly, Carol Russo and I spent a few hours folding, stuffing, sealing, and stamping 603 "Thank You" letters. I was especially delighted that we even had very appropriate "Thank You" stamps for them.

The addressees were all those parishioners who have contributed to our parish in the past year that we could identify through their on-line giving, envelopes, or checks sent to our parish office.

We hope you were among the parishioners who received this letter. If you did not receive a letter and think you should have, please let us know.

As we begin Advent and thus a new liturgical year, I want to

encourage you, if you are not among the list of our parish's tracible donors, to consider starting **TODAY** to give in a way that will allow us to thank you next year.

To help you prepare for this Advent Season, we are extremely excited that this year we can again offer an in-person wreath making session with Eric Haydel. If you were unable to sign up in time or could not make it, Eric's video from last year is still available to help you start this season with the making of your own Advent Wreath https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yq=caW9-H1yM&t=47s.

Lighting an Advent Wreath each evening, maybe before dinner or when you get a quiet moment, can be a wonderful way to prepare yourself spiritually for Christmas.

Take a moment to strike a match or start the flame of a candle lighter, light the candle, and recall that the Light of Christ is Coming and in fact is *Already Here*. Just this simple reflection will place you squarely into the mystery of the Advent season.

As the Jesuit theologian, Karl Rahner, writes: "the term "Advent" connotes not only an arrival, but also that which is yet to come. The very word itself expresses a strange interpenetration of the present and the future of what now exists and what is yet to come, of possession and expectation."

There is then a real and rich tension embodied in this season: Christ has already been born and reigns as our Savior, Redeemer and Sanctifier, yet we are always on a journey to meet him. We are always in that already/not-yet state of being saved, redeemed, and sanctified but still waiting for full salvation, full redemption, and full sanctification. In short, we are graced, but still awaiting the fullness of grace – when Christ will be all in all. Just imagine that!

So, let us light our Advent Wreath each night to embrace the mystery embodied in this season and celebrate all that we are and all that we can become as individuals and as a generous faith community through the grace of Christ Jesus our incarnate Lord. With Advent Blessings,

Al comenzar el Adviento y, por lo tanto, un nuevo año litúrgico, quiero animarlos, si no están entre la lista de donantes rastreables de nuestra parroquia, a considerar de donar a partir de **HOY** de una manera que nos permita agradecerles el próximo año.

Para ayudarlos a prepararse para esta temporada de Adviento, estamos muy emocionados de que este año podamos ofrecer nuevamente una sesión de preparación de las coronas en persona con Eric Haydel. Si no pudieron inscribirse a tiempo o no podían venir, el video de Eric del

año pasado todavía está disponible para ayudarlos a comenzar esta temporada con la fabricación de su propia corona de Adviento <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=yqcaW9-H1yM&t=47s</u>.

Encender la corona de Adviento cada noche, tal vez antes de la cena o cuando tienen un momento tranquilo, puede ser una manera maravillosa de prepararse espiritualmente para la Navidad.

Tómense un momento para encender un fósforo o la llama de un encendedor de velas, prenda la vela y recuerde que la Luz de Cristo está viniendo y, de hecho, ya *está aquí*. Sólo esta simple reflexión los colocará de lleno en el misterio del tiempo de Adviento.

Como escribe el teólogo jesuita Karl Rahner: "el término "Adviento" connota no sólo una llegada, sino también lo que está por venir. La misma palabra expresa una extraña interpenetración del presente y el futuro de lo que ahora existe y lo que está por venir, de posesión y e xpectativa".

Hay entonces una tensión real y rica encarnada en esta temporada: Cristo ya ha nacido y reina como nuestro Salvador, Redentor y Santificador; sin embargo, siempre estamos en un viaje para encontrarlo. Siempre estamos en ese estado de ya/aún no ser salvados, redimidos y santificados, pero aún esperando la salvación, la redención y la santificación completas. En resumen, tenemos las gracias, pero aún esperamos la plenitud de la gracia, cuando Cristo será todo en todo. ¡Imagínense eso!

Por lo tanto, iluminemos nuestra Corona de Adviento cada noche para abrazar el misterio encarnado en esta temporada y celebrar todo lo que somos y todo lo que podemos llegar a ser como individuos y como una comunidad de fe generosa a través de la gracia de Cristo Jesús, nuestro Señor encarnado.

### The Story of the Advent Wreath

Advent wreaths were originally part of folk traditions of Northern Europe. Wreaths of evergreens were decorated with candles to symbolize life and light during the dark months of winter. Legend has it that Saint Boniface first gave the wreath its Christian meaning in the eighth century, and we have been using these wreaths as part of our Advent preparation ever since. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God. The evergreens signify continuous life. Each of the four candles represents one of the Sundays of Advent. The purple candles represent the prayer, penance, preparation, and good works we are called to do during Advent. The color purple signifies the "royalty" of Jesus Christ. The pink candle is lit on the Third Sunday of Advent, which is the Sunday of rejoicing. The light of the candles reminds us that Jesus comes into the darkness of our lives to bring newness, life, and hope. We gradually add more light each Sunday until Christ, our Light, comes at Christmas.

## Advent Wreath Blessing

Blessed are you, O God. You sent your Son to be the Light of the world and to spread his light of love to all. Pour forth your blessing upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May its growing brightness remind us of the approaching nearness of your Son, so that the day of His coming may find us prepared and filled with joy in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

### Prayers for Your Home

As you light the candles of your wreath each week these prayers may be helpful:

## First Sunday of Advent:

Wonderful God of light, as we prepare for the coming of Jesus, may our hearts and lives be filled with wonder and praise. May the spirit of peace and love, which Jesus brought into the world, touch our family and friends. May we be renewed and strengthened in these gifts—in our hearts, in our minds, and in all of our actions. Amen. (Light one purple candle)

### Second Sunday of Advent:

Generous God of light, we have been baptized into one family in Jesus the Christ whose coming we prepare to celebrate. During this holy season, may we empty our hearts and minds of selfish intentions so that being filled with your light we might celebrate your presence in each other and serve each other generously. Amen. (Light two purple candles)

## Third Sunday of Advent:

Merciful God of light, it is in your love that we find lasting joy. Through prayer and kind service may we prepare ourselves for the gift of peace and joy you want to give us. Help us to have generous, unselfish and forgiving hearts so that with joy we may herald your coming to all those we meet. Amen. (Light the two purple candles, and now the pink candle).

## Fourth Sunday of Advent

Loving God of light, you reveal your love to us in the gift of Jesus. Help us to reveal that love to the friendless, the sick, the suffering, the poor and all those in need. Help us to be - and to see - the face of Jesus in one another. Amen. (Light all four candles).



### Bendiciones Y Oraciones De Las Coronas De Adviento Para Su Hogar

Al encender las velas de sus coronas cada semana, estas oraciones pueden ser útiles:

Durante esta temporada santa, haz que vaciemos nuestros corazones y mentes de intenciones egoístas para que, llenos de tu luz, podamos celebrar tu presencia en los demás y servirnos generosamente los unos a los otros. Amén. (Luz, dos velas moradas).

#### Tercer Domingo de Adviento

Dios misericordioso de luz, es en tu amor que encontramos una alegría duradera. Para que a través de la oración y el servicio afectuoso nos preparemos para el don de la paz y la alegría que nos quieres dar. Ayúdanos a tener corazones generosos, desinteresados y clementes, para que con alegría podamos anunciar tu venida a todos los que encontremos. Amén. (Luz, las dos velas púrpuras, y ahora la vela rosa).

#### Cuarto Domingo de Adviento

Dios de amor y de luz, nos revelas tu amor en el don de Jesús. Ayúdanos a manifestar ese amor a los que no tienen amigos, a los enfermos, a los que sufren, a los pobres y a todos los necesitados. Ayúdanos a ser —y a ver— el rostro de Jesús en cada uno de nosotros. Amén. (Luz, las cuatro velas).



# A Message from the Finance Council

Thank you to all who have supported the parish financially over the past 18 months. We are mindful of the hardships brought upon by COVID and appreciate your generosity.

As you can see from the chart below, there is a concerning trend regarding the parish finances that we feel is important to address. The offertory for the first quarter of the fiscal year is:

- •8% below the prior year
- •14% below the three months ended September 30, 2019
- •26% below the three months ended September 30, 2018

In order to meet the current year operating expenses, our goal is to have the offertory back to 2019 levels. We need your help to get there.



# Fr. James A. Woods, S.J.

Let us pray in thanksgiving for the life of Rev. James A. Woods, S.J., who was called to eternal life on Saturday, November 20, 2021, at Campion Center in Weston, MA. He was 90. Fr. Woods was Boston College's longest-serving dean and the namesake of the University's Woods College of Advancing Studies, formerly known as the Evening College. He led the school for 44 years before stepping down in 2012.

Fr. Woods was born in Boston, MA on March 24, 1931, entered the Society of Jesus on August 14, 1948 at Shadowbrook in Lenox, MA, and was ordained on June 17, 1961 at Weston College in Weston, MA. He pronounced final vows on October 1, 1979.




