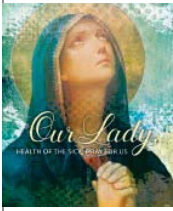

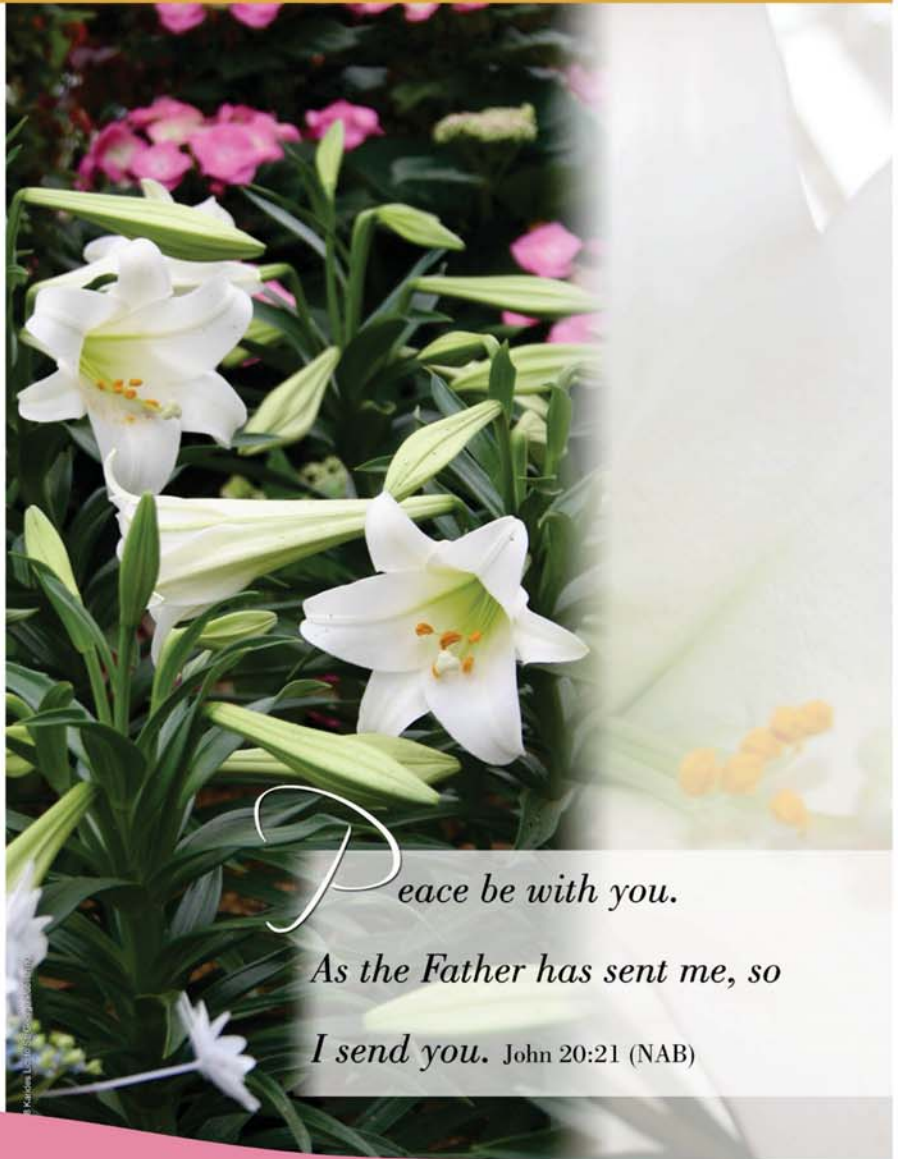

At a recent community meeting, many residents were expressing their fears—fears of crime, terrorism, the economy, health care, etc. It seems as though we are controlled by fear. People base their decisions and actions on the negative things that might happen, rather than the positive things that could happen. Such negative thinking only engenders more fear and apprehension, drowning out the possibility of a better, more creative society.

The Apostles lived in fear. They hid in the upper room, wondering what was happening and if they would be the next victims of Roman wrath. They did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead, or that they were about to embark on a mission of

When we were learning how to swim, the instructor would show us different things to try, such as ducking our heads under water, and blowing bubbles, and eventually jumping in the water. Before she asked us to do anything, however, she would always demonstrate and end with the admonition, “Don’t be afraid! There’s nothing to it—it’s easy!” These small reassurances encouraged her six and seven-year old students to strike out on their own and swim.

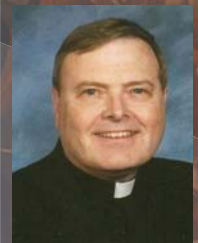

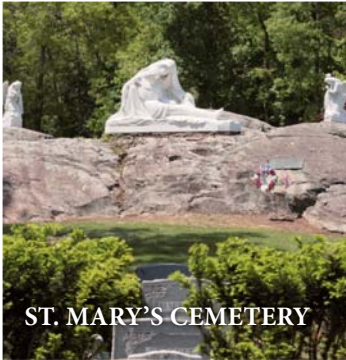
