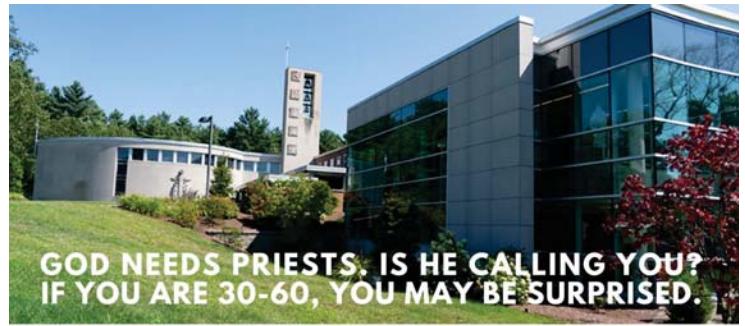

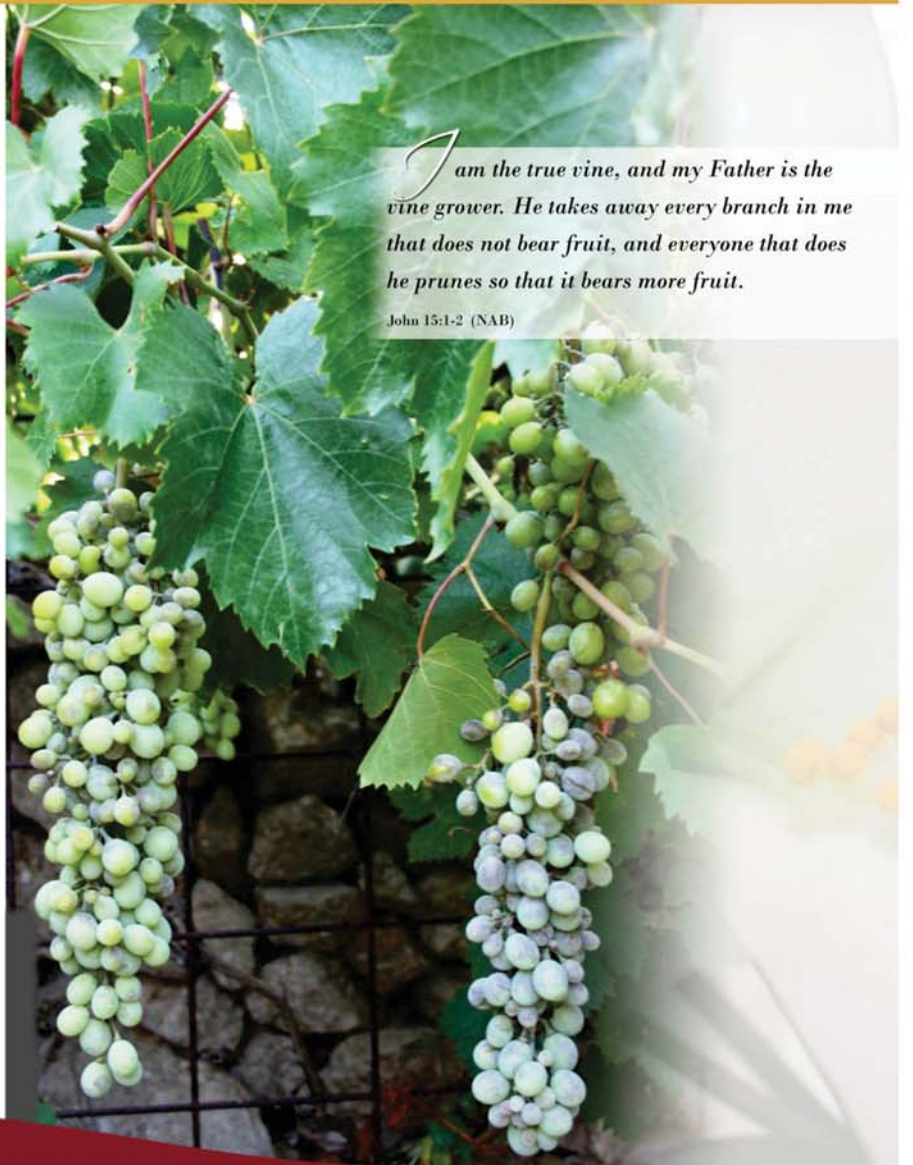

They put their envelope in too, and it often represents some sacrifice the family made or a special project done just for the church. 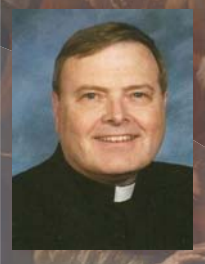

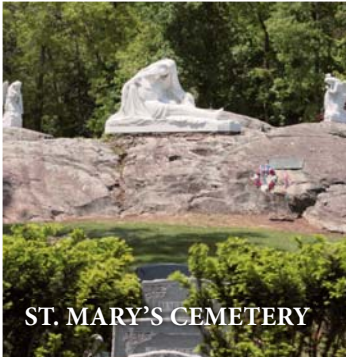

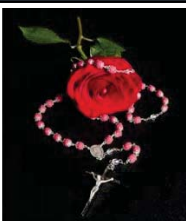
