



Parkinson's Disease Series:
Part 1 What is Parkinson's disease?

Parkinson's disease (PD) is a movement disorder of the nervous system that gets worse over time. As nerve cells (neurons) in parts of the brain weaken, are damaged, or die, people may notice problems with movement, tremors, stiffness in the limbs or the trunk of the body, or impaired balance. As symptoms progress, people may have difficulty walking, talking, or completing other simple tasks. Not everyone with one or more of these symptoms has PD, as the symptoms appear in other diseases as well. There is no cure for PD, but research is ongoing, and medications or surgery can often provide substantial improvement in motor symptoms. The 4 primary symptoms of PD include:

- 1. Tremor (shaking),
- 2. Rigidity (muscle stiffness),
- 3. Bradykinesia (slowing down of movements), decrease in facial expressions (masked face),
- 4. Impaired balance and changes in posture which can increase the risk of falls (referred to as a Parkinsonian gait).

PD does not affect everyone the same way. The rate of progression and the symptoms differ among individuals. PD symptoms typically begin on one side of the body. However, the disease eventually affects both sides, although symptoms are often less severe on one side than on the other.

Other problems may accompany PD, such as depression, difficulty swallowing, speech changes, and sleep or cognitive problems. For further information on symptoms refer to the following website. Parkinson's Disease | National Institute of Neurological Disorders and Stroke (nih.gov)

A famous saying, used in politics and religion, says "Don't listen to what I say, watch what I do." It's the opposite of another proverb, "Do as I say, not as I do." Actions do indeed speak louder than words. What we do and how we act, especially when we think no one is watching, says more about our values and beliefs that any profession of faith, hope or love. For a good idea to become a value, it has to move from the mind and heart to the hands and feet. It has to change our behavior and become visible by what we do. Generosity is not real until we give; faith is not real until we pray; kindness is not real until we treat others well. When we put our values into practice, it not only changes others, but it also changes us. The very practice of our beliefs helps them to grow stronger and makes them more a part of who we are and who we will become. 
